Steven Galetta, MD is currently the Philip K. Moskowitz, MD, Professor of Neurology and Ophthalmology, and Chair of the Department of Neurology at the NYU Langone Medical Center

He is co-author of the textbook, Neuro-ophthalmology: Diagnosis and Management, 3rd edition published in 2018. In 1998, Dr. Galetta was awarded the Louis Duhring Outstanding Clinical Specialist Award from the University of Pennsylvania, and in 2014, he was named NYU Langone's Master Clinician.

In 2004, he was honored for his role as an educator by receiving the American Neurological Association's Distinguished Neurology Teacher Award, and the Alpha Omega Alpha Robert J. Glaser Distinguished Teacher Award from the Association of American Medical Colleges. In 2008, he received the Parker J.
