Dr. Chetkovich is a neuroscientist, neurologist and professor and chair of Neurology at Vanderbilt University Medical School. Dr. Chetkovich is graduate of the Medical Scientist Training Program (MSTP) at Baylor College of Medicine. He completed his neurology residency and then a postdoctoral fellowship focused on basic mechanisms of neurological disease at UCSF. Dr. Chetkovich joined Northwestern as an Assistant Professor in 2002, then served as Professor of Neurology and Physiology and the Director of the Feinberg School of Medicine Medical Scientist Training Program before becoming chair at Vanderbilt in 2017. His research laboratory is focused on the molecular mechanisms that underlie the targeting of ion channels to synapses and other specialized areas of neurons as related neuropsychiatric diseases such as epilepsy, autism and major depressive disorder. His NIH-supported work has resulted in the publication of numerous peer-reviewed articles and he has been an invited speaker at lectures and conferences nationally and internationally. In his role as chairman at Vanderbilt, Dr. Chetkovich has doubled the size of the faculty, doubled volume of neurology visits and tripled the NIH grant budget. He serves as a reviewer for numerous journals and is a member of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology Certification Committee, preparing exam questions for board certification for neurologists across the country.
