Dr. Gwenn Garden is H. Houston Merritt Distinguished Professor and Chair of the Department of Neurology at the UNC School of Medicine. She also serves as co-director of the Duke-UNC Alzheimer's Disease Research Center. Dr. Garden joined UNC in 2019 after serving as the Vice Chair for Education in the Department of Neurology, University of Washington. She is an active clinician providing inpatient care and neurological consultations at UNC Hospital where her clinical interests focus on neuroinflammation, neurodegeneration, and dementia.

Dr. Garden completed her undergraduate education at Northwestern University and received her MD and PhD in Physiology and Biophysics at the University of Washington. Following residency training and a research fellowship at the Brigham and Women's Hospital and the Harvard Longwood Neurology Training Program, Garden joined the faculty at the University of Washington in 2000 and as the Vice Chair of Education from 2013 to 2019. Dr. Garden's research focus is neuroinflammation, neurodegeneration, and dementia. Her research aim is to elucidate the cellular interactions that occur between immune and neural cells in the setting of ischemia, trauma, seizures, and neurodegenerative diseases. Her laboratory has earned significant NIH funding and produced an extensive bibliography of publications.
