John D. England, MD, is the Richard M. Paddison Professor of Neurology and Neuroscience and Chair of the Department of Neurology at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center (LSUHSC) School of Medicine in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Dr. England is board certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and the American Board of Electrodiagnostic Medicine. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Neurology, a fellow of the American Neurological Association, an elected Honorary Member of the French Society of Neurology, and a member of the Peripheral Nerve Society and the American Association of Neuromuscular & Electrodiagnostic Medicine.

Dr. England has served as Chairman of the Polyneuropathy Task Force of the American Academy of Neurology, the American Academy of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, and the American Association of Neuromuscular and Electrodiagnostic Medicine. He was Chair of the Guidelines Development Committee of the American Academy of Neurology from 2009-2013. He is a past-President of the American Association of Neuromuscular and Electrodiagnostic Medicine (AANEM) and the American Academy of Clinical Neurophysiology. In 2016 he received the Distinguished Physician Award from the American Association of Neuromuscular and Electrodiagnostic Medicine (AANEM). He is a past-Chair of the American Board of Electrodiagnostic Medicine (ABEM). He is currently Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of the Neurological Sciences*, the official journal of the World Federation of Neurology. He is also Editor-in-Chief of the *Encyclopedia of the Neurological Sciences*. He serves on the Editorial Advisory Boards of *World Neurology* and *eNeurologicalSci*. He is the Chair of the Publications and Communications Committee for the World Federation of Neurology and the President of the Applied Research Group on Neuromuscular Diseases for the World Federation of Neurology. He is the president of the Association of University Professors of Neurology (AUPN). In addition, he has served as an editorial consultant to many other peer-reviewed journals, including *Muscle and Nerve*, *Annals of Neurology*, *European Journal of Neurology*, *The Lancet Neurology*, and *Neurology*. Dr. England's primary clinical interests include neuromuscular diseases (especially peripheral neuropathy) and electrophysiology, and his primary research interests are the pathophysiology of peripheral neuropathies and sodium channel modulation in experimental models of peripheral neuropathy. He is an internationally recognized expert in peripheral

neuropathy and is a frequently invited lecturer both nationally and internationally. Many of his collaborative efforts serve to form the basis of diagnosis and care of patients with peripheral neuropathy. He has been principal or co-investigator on fifty clinical or basic research studies. This body of work has produced more than three hundred publications.
